Dear Valued Customer,

We would like to provide you with an update concerning Bristol-Myers Squibb Medical Imaging's efforts to support the U.S. and Canadian Nuclear Medicine communities since the voluntary recall and absence from the market of Mallinckrodt Tc-99m generators three weeks ago. First and foremost, we want to thank you for your patience and understanding as we work through the issues associated with this significant increase to demand of Tc-99m generators from our Billerica, Massachusetts facility.

Leveraging our experience from a similar occurrence in 2005, we immediately mobilized all resources necessary to produce Tc-99m generators to meet industry demand. In the first full week following the interruption of North American generator supply, we manufactured more than 800 additional Tc-99m generators, delivering more than 2,700 additional curies of Mo-99 to domestic hospitals, clinics, and radiopharmacies. Simultaneously, we provided all necessary accessories (vials, shields, etc.) to those new accounts receiving our units.


This volume of generators manufactured is similar to the quantity we sustained for six months during 2005 and 2006. Through collaborative efforts with key suppliers such as MDS Nordion, we are confident that we are in a position to sustain this volume indefinitely.

We also want to let you know that we have put into place enhanced delivery systems to help support the distribution needs of our customers and will continue to evaluate and implement other improvements to delivery as the situation continues to evolve.

Please know that our commitment to support the Nuclear Medicine community by supplying Tc-99m generators solely over an unknown timeframe is a top priority for Bristol-Myers Squibb Medical Imaging.
